1. Baseline

St. George Foundation Sierra Leone in partnership with Toybox-UK, government line ministries and participating communities in Western Area Urban and Western Area Rural Districts, is implementing a two-year project titled: 'Education Support for Street Connected Children (SCC). The project started on 1st April 2019, and it will end on 31st March 2021.

The project aims to achieve increased enrolment and retention of SCC in school by creating an empowering and protective environment for SCC in the community, at home and at schools. The intervention logic is centred on provision of school materials and uniforms to increase access, and innovative learning approaches to enhance attitudes and capacities of caregivers, pimps and community leaders to the rights of children.

4. Baseline

Baseline study undertaken by St. George Foundation at the start of the project in April 2019 on percentage of caregivers who show positive attitude to sending children to school. The report reveals that 77 per cent of caregivers in the project area are willing to regularly send their children to school and support them. The report further highlights poverty as a key barrier keeping children out of school.
